Sondra E. Hayes is a professional storyteller and narrator who has performed at storytelling events, churches, and conferences, and with the Philharmonic



Orchestra of Indianapolis, and the Indianapolis Chamber Orchestra. Sondra was awarded the Frank Basile Emerging Stories Fellowship by Storytelling Arts of Indiana and the Frank Basile Emerging Stories Fellowship.

Hayes studied playwriting with Dr. Andrew Black at the Indiana Writers Center and later adapted her children's book, *The Princess, the Witch, and the Magic Socks*, into a play for the Indy Fringe Festival. Hayes, Spanish Professor

Emerita from the University of Indianapolis and violinist with the Philharmonic Orchestra of Indianapolis, enjoys public speaking, writing memoirs, short stories, plays, and poetry. Two of her poems, "The Body Died, Not Me" and "Look for Me Búscame" were published in the 2023 *Friendly Offerings* Volume 2 from The Write Group of Fairfield Friends. Most recently, Sondra authored 900 haikus in her soon to be published book, Haikus for Healing the Cancer Patient.

She is a member of the International Women Writers Guild, Indiana Playwrights Circle, Indiana Writers Center, Brick Street Poetry, Fairfield Friends Writing Group, Kafe Kuumba, and Storytelling Arts of Indiana.



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
